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#### **Introduction**

The aftermath of Somalia's long running conflicts have destroyed country's Asset including infrastructures, and engulfed many lives while displacements still to continue due to the periodically sliding conflicts and the rapidly political changes which the country let to become host mass destruction of public and private sectors, chaotic, weak administration and no rule of law and without effective central government since 1991.

These prolonged civil conflicts in Somalia have fostered a lost generation who has no experience of a kind of effective Government and poor access to basic social services particularly education and employment opportunities

#### **Background Information**

Somali Women Vision Organization (SWV) was established in 1998 by a group of Somali women intellectuals in Garowe, Somalia. Puntland, Somali Women Vision (SWV) is a grassroots non-governmental, non-political organization, which was founded to respond to the needs of women and children in particular and the community in general in the areas of economic Empowerment, Fishing, education, human rights, Environment protection, humanitarian aid, Health and research programs

SWV is aimed to tackle the humanitarian crisis including droughts and disaster prevention and also develops community basic social Services needs and creates employment opportunities and income generation projects for the Youth, Women, IDPs and poor rural community to reduce the level of poverty and contribute National Development Goals

Since 1998, SWV has been successful to improve the maternity health centers, water berkders, water dams/catchment, gullies erosion control, fishing training, Orphan assistance program, women economic empowerment, emergence response, peace building, protection and

Establishment of vocational skills centers for promotion and support of different vuneralable people in different regions in Somalia

**Geographical Area:** The headquarter of SWV organization is in Somalia, and operate in all Puntland especially in all regions of northeast, Somalia.

## Programming and cross-functional expertise

SWV staff has theoretical and practical program management capacity through various capacity building programs provided by the international and UN partners. Notably, Care-Netherlands recruited an external consultant (Zahra Koshin) who trained our program for 6 consecutive months on PCM and other areas for organizational and program management. Also, SWV program has very practical experiences from implementing livelihood environment, wash, health projects activities.

We have capacity to work in the geographical areas of the proposed project activities, as we have already implemented similar activities and still maintain relations with the community as we have done periodic assessments in the areas for other projects.

SWV has all required office equipments, office space and capacity to hire transport for the project activities
